Gad Elmaleh was born in Casablanca, Morocco on 19 April 1971.

Of Jewish **descent** / **descendant**, Gad Elmaleh studied at Georges Bizet school and Lycée Lyuately in Casablanca.

His father was an amateur mime artist, but Elmaleh **cites** / **tells** Charlie Chaplin as his **mainly** / **main** early career influence.

Gad Elmaleh moved to Montreal in Canada in 1988. **When** / **Whilst** there, he worked in the shipping department of a **garment** / **clothes** company owned by members of his family and he also studied political science.

In 1992 Gad Elmaleh left Canada and went to Paris. He had success as a stand-up **humorist** / **comedian** and like Edouard Baer, he was a student of actress Isabelle Nanty.

In 1995, he had his first one-man show "Décalages".

As well as **continuing** / **sustaining** with his one-man comedy shows, Gad Elmaleh took on various acting roles.

He **depicted** / **concealed** one of his characters, Chouchou, a Moroccan transvestite streetwalker, on stage and screen. Gad Elmaleh used to live with

actress Anne Brochet. They have a son. Brochet wrote a book, *Trajet d'une amoureuse econduite*, about her relationship and break **down** / **up** with Gad Elmaleh.

More recently he was going **out** / **on** with ballerina Aurélie Dupont.

In this **review** / **critique** of *Priceless*, The Guardian describes Gad Elmaleh as "a very funny young Moroccan-born Jewish comic whose **scantily** / **hugely** popular one-man shows are about the closest France gets to really good stand-up." His film credits include playing Chick in *Mood Indigo*, adapted from Boris Vian's novel.
