



Sarangi

The *sarangi*, also called the *saran*, is a traditional instrument from Nepal. The word *sarangi* means “a hundred colors”, which refers to the many sounds produced by this instrument. The *sarangi* is a stringed instrument made of wood with three main strings. It is played with a bow like a violin. The *sarangi* is played by the *Garndarba* people. In the past, the *Garndarba* travelled from village to village, singing about heroes, battles, and the stories of people they met on their journey. In modern Nepali music, the *sarangi* is one of the most famous instruments. Nepali folk bands feature popular modern *sarangi* players, encouraging young musicians to learn this traditional instrument.
