

RELATIVE PRONOUNS 3

Read the following:

A **relative pronoun** is a word that introduces a **relative clause** and connects it to an **independent clause**.

Jannie Cobb is the woman  **WHO** participated in the NASA female program.

A clause beginning with a relative pronoun answers questions such as: Which one? How many? What kind?

The most common relative pronouns are: **WHICH, WHO, WHOSE, THAT, WHERE, WHEN**.

In the next exercise you will practice how to use **WHICH** and **WHERE**.

- Use "**where**" when the clause you are connecting tells you where something happened.

This is the hotel **where** we stayed last holidays. (Where did we stay?)

- Use "**which**" when the clause you are connecting tells you about the place itself (no action happened)

This is the restaurant **which** I told you about.

Choose **WHICH** or **WHERE**.

11. When can we go back to that beach we ate that delicious fish?
