In some stories, future cities are **high-tech** and **shiny**. Skyscrapers are made of glass and metal, reaching higher than the (2)..... Not all future cities are perfect; some of them are even **terrifying**. In the book *1984*, the city is dark and controlled by a strict government. Cameras are everywhere, and people have no privacy. Writers like George Orwell use these ideas to show what could go (9)..... if we are not careful with technology and power.

Many stories also focus on **green** cities. In these cities, buildings are covered in plants, and people use solar energy and wind power. There are no cars, only bikes and electric buses. These cities are (10)....., quiet, and great for the planet. These stories help us imagine a world where we live in harmony with nature, and inspire us to try living like this in our own lifetime.

Future cities might seem far away, but they make us think: How can we make today's cities better? Maybe one day, you can help design the city of the future!
