- ❖ **Adjective + preposition + Noun** (Tính từ và giới từ kết hợp với danh từ)

- Ở một số trường hợp, tính từ và giới từ được kết hợp với nhau và theo sau đó là danh từ.

Ví dụ: I was **good at maths and science**.

- ❖ **Cấu trúc “Could + be”**

- Cấu trúc “**Could + be**” được dùng để nói về 1 việc gì đó có khả năng sẽ xảy ra trong tương lai, nhưng chưa chắc chắn điều đó sẽ xảy ra.

Ví dụ:

- + That noise **could be** a dog.
- + The meeting **could be** at 10 a.m. or 11 a.m.
- + This **could be** a great opportunity for you.

- Cấu trúc “**Could + be + (a/an)**” có thể dùng để nói về khả năng trong tương lai ta sẽ trở thành ai, trở thành nhân vật như thế nào hoặc làm nghề gì.

Ví dụ: You **could be** a teacher.
