

SECOND THIRD MIXED CONDITIONALS

Examples:

If I went to the party, I would be tired tomorrow. 2nd

If I had gone to the party, I would have been tired. 3rd

In the first sentence, we use the second conditional because the party is in the future and we are imagining what the situation would be. In the second sentence, the party is in the past. We didn't go but we are imagining what would have happened if we had gone to it.

Mixed Conditionals:

2nd

3rd

If I went to the party, I would have been tired.

Or

2nd

3rd

I would be tired tomorrow if I had gone to the party.
