"Uncle Tom's Cabin"	fought for equality for women and African Americans
United States Women's Movement	escaped slavery by using fake paperwork; wrote an autobiography detailing the horrors of slavery; most famous for his skills as a speaker
Harriet Beecher Stowe	played a key role in the anti-slavery movement by founding the Philadelphia Female Anti-slavery Society
Lucretia Mott	former slave who escaped and was active in the Underground Railroad; was a union spy during the civil war
Harriet Tubman	a novel published in 1852 by teacher and author Harriet Beecher Stowe that stunned readers with graphic depiction of slavery's cruelty
Philadelphia Female Anti-slavery Society	a movement that helped Women's rights; grew out of abolition
Seneca Falls Convention of 1848	housewife author from Connecticut who wrote the book "uncle Tom's Cabin"
Frederick Douglas	organized by Elizabeth Cady Stanton which drafted a declaration of sentiments listing the demand for women's rights such as equality and the right to vote; also called the First Women's Rights Convention
