

Reflexive or intensive pronouns:

<p>Singular: Myself herself yourself, itself, himself</p>	<p>Plural: ourselves, Yourselves, themselves</p>

Use reflexive pronouns when the subject and object are the same .if you remove a reflexive pronoun from a sentence, the sentence will no longer make sense.

Use intensive pronouns for emphasis, you can remove an intensive pronoun from a sentence and still make sense.
