

Present perfect

You've probably heard of Iguazú Falls – the huge waterfalls between Brazil and Argentina. I've seen them twice, but I want to see them again! I've only travelled by plane there. It's a two-hour flight from Buenos Aires, but you can also get there by coach. I've always stayed in Puerto Iguazú because there are regular buses to the falls. There are beautiful walking tours in the park, but the best thing I've done there is the boat trip. The views were amazing!

We use the present perfect to talk about life experiences.

I have been to Egypt and I have seen the pyramids.

She has had three different jobs this year – she has worked as a waitress, a shop assistant and a secretary.

We also use it to talk about past events which have a result in the present. We don't say when the event happened – the exact time isn't important.

Gustav has eaten the whole chicken! (= There's no chicken left for me.)

We have packed our bags. (= The bags are packed now.)

We form the present perfect affirmative with *have* / *has* and the past participle of the main verb.

To form the present perfect negative, we add *not* after *have / has*. In spoken or informal written English, we use the short forms *haven't* or *hasn't*.

Negative		
Subject	have / has + not	Past participle
I	haven't	
You	haven't	
He / She / It	hasn't	booked a holiday.
We	haven't	
They	haven't	

We form present perfect questions by placing *have / has* before the subject.

Questions		
Have / Has	Subject	Past participle
Have	I	
Have	you	
Has	he / she / it	booked a holiday?
Have	we	
Have	they	

We make short answers with *have / has* in the affirmative and *have / has + not* in the negative.

Short answers	
Affirmative	Negative
Yes, I / you / we / they have.	No, I / you / we / they haven't.
Yes, he / she / it has.	No, he / she / it hasn't.

TIP

In positive short answers, we don't use short forms.
'Have you met my brother?' 'Yes, I have.' (NOT Yes, I've.)
