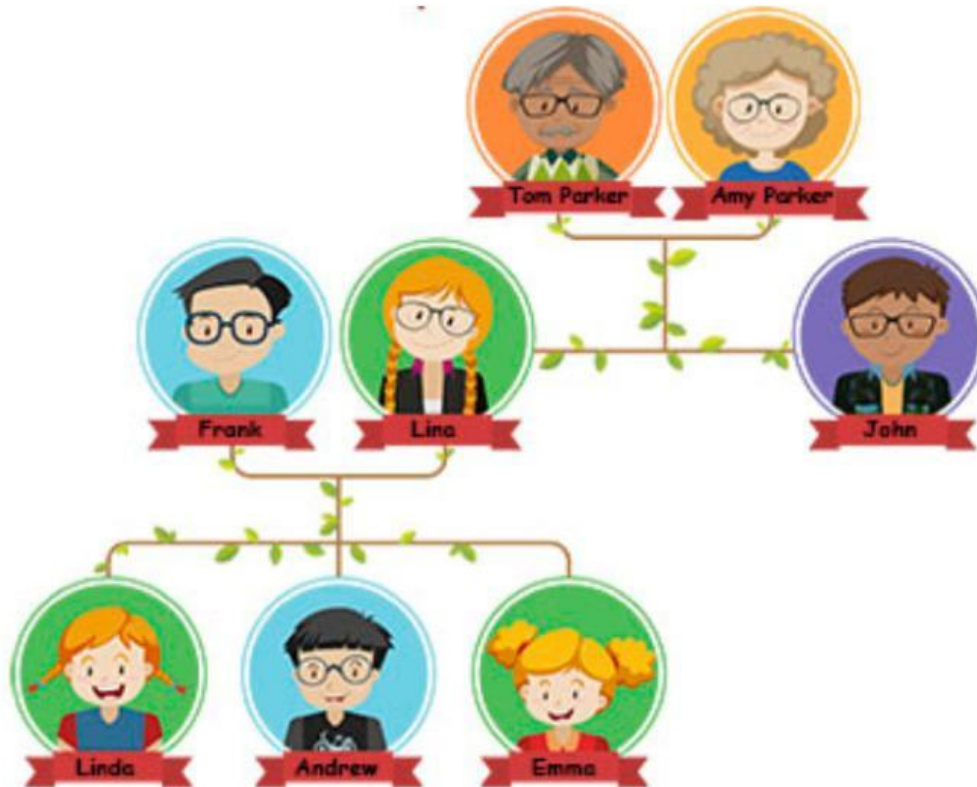

There was / There were: Affirmative

There was a family. *Hi havia una família.*

There were some children. *Hi havia (alguns) nens.*

There was / There were: Negative

There wasn't a family. *No hi havia una família.*

There weren't any children. *No hi havia nens.*

There was / There were: Interrogative

Was there a family? *Hi havia una família?*

Were there any children? *Hi havia nens?*

Short answers

Yes, there was. / No, there wasn't.

Yes, there were. / No, there weren't.

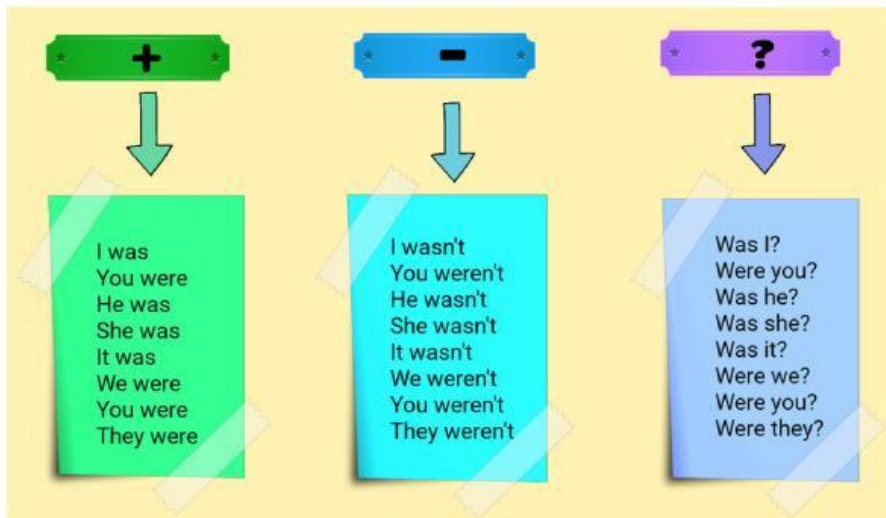
