Simple present tense is used to describe actions or situations that are regular, habitual, or generally true. The following are the functions of simple present tense;

Pattern:

(nominal)

(+) subject + to be + complement

(-) subject + to be + not + complement

(?) to be + subject + complement + ?

(verbal)

(+) subject + verb1 + complement

(-) subject + do/does + not + verb1+ complement

(?) do/does + subject + verb1+ complement + ?

Note:

- So, for subject I use to be → am and verb → do or verb without the s/es suffix.
- Meanwhile, subject you, they, we, and plural subject use to be → are and verb → do or verb without the s/es suffix.
- Finally, subject she, he, it, and singular subject use to be → is and verb → does or verb ending in s/es.

Example:

(nominal)

(+) You are tall.

(-) You are not tall.

(?) Are you tall?

(verbal)

(+) He goes to school.

(-) He does not go to school.

(?) Does he go to school?
