Modal verbs: *can*, *have to* and *must*

Can I borrow one of your dresses? (Is it OK?)

You **can** read a poem. (It's OK.)

You **can't** refuse. (It isn't OK.)

Do I **have to** sing a song? (Is it necessary?)

You **have to** try. (It's necessary.)

You **don't have to** sing a song. (It isn't necessary.)

You **mustn't** say 'yeah'. (Don't!)
