

We use **get + someone + to +infinitive** when we ask or tell somebody to do something. We use this in any context (not just people we have power over). It is informal.

We always say who did the action with this structure.

We **got our teacher to explain** the grammar again.

I'll **get my husband to pick** you **up** from the station.

Exercise. Rewrite the sentences using the structure **get + someone + to +infinitive** .
