

Mo Lam: The Ballad of People's Ways

- Mo Lam originated as a solo performance by a storyteller called Mo Lam Phuen.
- The word "Mo" in Mo Lam means "story," and "Lam" refers to "melody."
- Mo Lam for ritual ceremonies is used to communicate with Phi Fa, a spirit in Isan folklore.
- Mo Lam performances are only for entertainment and do not include moral lessons or social values.
- Khaen, a bamboo mouth organ, is the only musical instrument used in Mo Lam Klon performances.
- Mo Lam Mu performances are influenced by Li-kae costumes and involve a group of 15-30 performers.
- Mo Lam Ploen performers wear traditional Isan folk costumes, such as Pa Sin, for all female performers.
- Mo Lam Sing incorporates modern instruments and fun verses with exciting rhythms.

Mo Lam has remained popular because of its ability to adapt to social changes and reach all kinds of audiences.
