## 2A Simple present: affirmative and negative

We use the simple present to talk about:

- facts.

*I'm Italian.*

*We live in New York.*

*He doesn't work at a restaurant.*

- regular routines.

*I work every day.*

*We go to the movies on the weekend.*

*They get up at 10 on Sundays.*

We form negatives with **don't/doesn't** + the base form of the verb.

### 2.3 I / you / we / they

### he / she / it

We <b>work</b> in a hospital.	Laura <b>works</b> in an office.
+ I <b>teach</b> English.	He <b>teaches</b> Japanese.
They <b>have</b> a new car.	She <b>has</b> a beautiful apartment.
You <b>make</b> great coffee.	Simon <b>makes</b> good tea.
We <b>don't work</b> in a school.	Paul <b>doesn't work</b> in a store.
- I <b>don't teach</b> French.	He <b>doesn't teach</b> in a school.
They <b>don't have</b> a yard.	She <b>doesn't have</b> a dog.
You <b>don't love</b> your job.	Damian <b>doesn't love</b> his girlfriend.

We usually add **-s** to the verb to make the third person singular (**he/she/it**) form.

*He serves food in the restaurant.*

*She loves her job.*

*Ivan sings at festivals.*

*Camilla helps her parents on the weekend.*

## Spelling rules for third person singular (he/she/it)

We usually add **-s** to the base form.

**work**  $\Rightarrow$  **works**

When the verb ends in a consonant + **y**, we change the **y** to **i** and then we add **-es**.

**study**  $\Rightarrow$  **studies**

When the verb ends in **-sh**, **-ch**, **-x** or **-s**, we add **-es**.

**finish**  $\Rightarrow$  **finishes**   **watch**  $\Rightarrow$  **watches**

Some verbs are irregular.

**go**  $\Rightarrow$  **goes**   **do**  $\Rightarrow$  **does**   **have**  $\Rightarrow$  **has**
