Gap Years

Have you decided what you want to do when you finish school? Do you think you'll go to university? Today, having a gap year is something that many students do between leaving school and starting university. But a gap year can also be great for opening your mind, building your character and finding out about the world.

Many students use the gap year as a chance to travel around the world on a long holiday. But the idea is really to use this time to learn new skills and have new experiences before university, so lots of young people prefer to do something useful to help others. Companies like Raleigh International organise projects like this in different parts of the world, such as South America or Africa. Participants help local people and in return they learn a lot about themselves and develop new skills which are useful for their future.

Of course, if you are planning to have a gap year, you'll need money. Many do evening and weekend jobs while they are still at school in order to finance their gap year. Some also find jobs in the different countries they visit while they are on the gap year, but you need to find out about if you'll be allowed to work in each country before you leave home. For example, in many places you may need a special work permit. You won't want any unexpected surprises when you arrive at a border!
