Bluetooth technology, named after Harald Bluetooth, a Danish king known for uniting Denmark and Norway in the 10th century, was invented by Ericsson in 1994. The invention aimed to create a short-range wireless standard for connecting devices over short distances without cables.

[I] Bluetooth operates using radio waves in the 2.4 to 2.485 GHz frequency range. [II] It rapidly switches between frequencies within the range to transmit data and avoid interference from other nearby devices. [III] This technique enables Bluetooth to **maintain** a stable connection even when there are other wireless signals around. [IV]

Bluetooth provides specific functionalities like device pairing, data encryption, and data transmission among a variety of technological devices, including speakers, laptops, mobile phones, printers, and the likes. The technology employs a master-slave architecture where one device acts as the “master”, while the others act as “slaves”. The master device (often smartphones, laptops, or computers) initiates communication and coordinates data exchange with the slave devices (speakers, printers, etc.). Bluetooth devices form networks known as “**piconets**”, with the master device serving as the central coordinator.

Bluetooth technology has evolved over the years, with newer versions offering improved speed, range, and power efficiency. It has become ubiquitous in most of our modern devices, enabling seamless wireless connectivity for diverse applications.
