Ectopic Pregnancy	A. A condition in which the baby is born before the 37th week of pregnancy, often leading to health complications.
Miscarriage	B. A life-threatening condition that causes high blood pressure and swelling in the mother, also known as preeclampsia.
Stillbirth	C. A surgical procedure used to deliver a baby through an incision in the mother's abdomen and uterus.
Toxemia	D. A pregnancy complication where the fertilized egg implants outside the uterus, usually in a fallopian tube.
Cesarean Section	E. The loss of a pregnancy before the 20th week, often due to genetic or health-related factors.
Premature Birth	F. The birth of a baby that has died after the 20th week of pregnancy.
