VEHICLE AHEAD OF YOU. MAKE SURE YOU CAN STOP SAFELY, IF NECESSARY.

- IF YOU NEED TO CROSS SEVERAL FREEWAY LANES, CROSS THEM ONE AT A TIME. IF YOU WAIT UNTIL ALL THE LANES ARE CLEAR, YOU MAY CAUSE TRAFFIC _____ OR A COLLISION.
