Look and read.

"Grandpa, can you read me a story, please?" Jill asks.
"OK, Jill," says Grandpa.



Once upon a time, a king and a queen **lived** in a palace with their daughter, Princess Anna.



One day, Anna **met** Prince Robin. He was very handsome. Anna **loved** Robin and Robin **loved** her too.



An old woman **made** some lovely wedding clothes for Anna.



On the wedding day, people **came** from all over the country. The crowd **cheered**. Anna **was** happy and the people **were** happy for Anna.



The next day, Anna and Robin **said** goodbye and they **went** to live in Robin's beautiful palace.

They **lived** happily ever after.

- For regular verbs, we add:
-ed ask - **asked**
-d live - **lived**
- For irregular verbs,
- the spelling **changes**: come - **came**
- the spelling **does not change**: put - **put**
