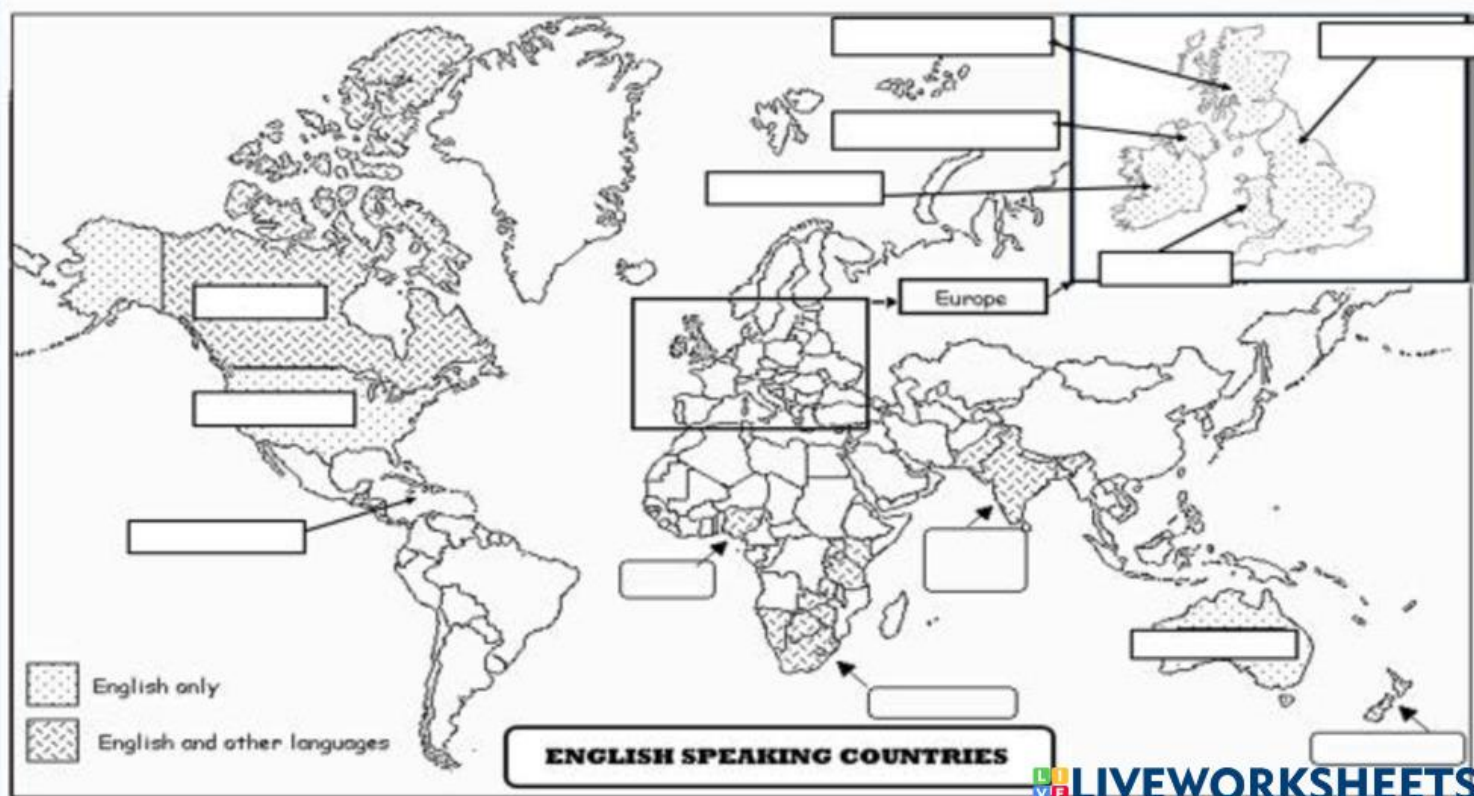

Amazing facts about the country

- Australia is the only continent:
 - that is also an island
 - that has over 10,000 beaches
- It is the 6th largest country.
- It is the world's smallest and flattest continent.
- More than two thirds of the country is desert, called "the Outback."
- 80% of the population lives within 50 km of the coast.
- It is 14 times bigger than France.

Amazing facts about the seasons

- Summer: from December to February
- Winter: from June to August

Amazing facts about the animals

- About 88% of the animals are endemic to the country - they only live in Australia.
- 40 million The estimated number of kangaroos living on the continent.
- 55 The number of kangaroo species.
- 800 The number of bird species.
- The Great Barrier Reef is the biggest coral reef in the world: it is 2,600 km long.
- 755 The number of reptile species (= the highest number in the world).

Why so many lethal animals?

- There are a lot of dangerous animals in Australia because the soils are very old and infertile. So only the most resistant creatures survive, like cold-blooded predators (reptiles) and insects.
- There are very few mammals because they need a lot of resources to survive (for example, a mammal needs to eat regularly, whereas a crocodile or a python can survive on one good meal... a year!).

Amazing facts about the people

The first people to live in Australia were the Aborigines. They have lived there for more than 40,000 years.

In the 19th century, many British convicts were sent to Australia, a British colony at the time. A "First Fleet" of British ships arrived in Australia in 1788.

Today, about 22% of Australians have a convict ancestor.

About 25% of the population was born in another country.

More than 10% of the population is of Asian origin.
