A. GRAMMAR

- Participle adjective (Tính từ phân từ)**

- Tính từ phân từ là các tính từ được tạo thành từ các động từ. Chúng thường sẽ có đuôi là “-ing” hoặc “-ed”. (Ví dụ như động từ “surprise” có thể tạo thành 2 tính từ phân từ “surprising” và “surprised”.)
- Tính từ hiện tại phân từ (-ing)** được dùng để nói về người, vật, tình huống **gây nên cảm nhận, cảm giác** cho ai đó.

Ex: It was a **boring** class.

- Tính từ quá khứ phân từ (-ed)** được dùng để nói ai **có cảm nhận, cảm giác** như thế nào.

Ex: He was **bored** during the class.
