


2. Past Simple

Positive (✓)	S + V _{2/ed}	She studied English.
Negative (✗)	S + didn't + V ₀	She didn't study English.
Question (?)	Did + S + V ₀ ... ?	Did she study English?
	(✓) → Yes , S + did . (✗) → No , S + didn't .	(✓) → Yes , she did . (✗) → No , she didn't .

(+) S + am / is / are + V₃

(-) S + am / is / are + not + V₃

Example:

1. **Someone** is standing at the door. (+)

(= I don't know who it is)

2. Did you see **anyone**? (?)

Note: We can use "some" in questions if we are making a request or an offer.

3. Can I have something else? (request)		
4. Everyone has gone home. (= all the people)		
5. We saw nothing . (= we didn't see anything)		
Note: We use a singular verb after an indefinite pronoun:		
6. Everybody loves Sally.

places	everywhere	nowhere
