

# Top Trumps: Animal Edition – Instructions for Students (A1-A2 Level)

Listen and read the game instructions then com-

**How to Play:** plete the questions below.

## 1. Get your cards

Each player has the same number of cards.

Each card has a picture of an animal and five pieces of information:

- Height (How **tall**[adj] it is)
- Length (How **long**[adj] it is)
- Weight (How **heavy**[adj] it is)
- Age (How **long**[adj] it can live)
- Special fact (**interesting**[adj] fact)



Cat	
Height	30cm
Length	50cm
Weight	5kg
Age	15
Special Fact	There are over 500 million domestic cats in the world.

## 2. Take turns

- The first player looks at their top card and chooses one category.
- They say a sentence using a comparative. Example:
  - My animal is taller than yours!
- The other players check their top cards and read the number in the same category.

## 3. Find the winner

- The player with the biggest number (or the smallest, depending on the category) wins the round.
- They take all the other players' top cards and put them at the bottom of their own deck.

## 4. If there is a tie

- If two players have the same number, they both choose a new category from their card.

## 5. Keep playing

- The game continues until one player has all the cards or until time runs out.
- The player with the most cards at the end wins!

## Useful Sentences to Practise:

### Comparatives (to compare two animals)

- My elephant is heavier than your lion.
- The giraffe is taller than the zebra.
- This snake is longer than the crocodile.
- A parrot is older than a rabbit.

### Superlatives (to say something is the most)

- The blue whale is the heaviest animal.
- The cheetah is the fastest animal.
- The tortoise is the oldest animal in the game.
- The anaconda is the longest snake.

Comprehension Questions for Top Trumps Instructions

3. What does the first player do on their turn?
4. What happens if a player has the highest or lowest number in a category?
