book report (n phr.) /bʊk riːpɔ:rt/	a book description written by students after they have finished reading it	In our literature class, we learn how to write a book report .
test (n) /test/	a set of questions or exercises used in school to assess a student's ability or skill	She is studying for her final math test .

delighted (adj) /dɪˈlaɪtɪd/	very pleased or happy	Last month, he was delighted because his basketball team won.
annoyed (adj) /əˈnɔɪd/	a little angry	Yesterday, Peter's father was annoyed because he didn't study for the exam.

customs (n) /'kʌstəmz/	the place at a port or an airport where some officers check your luggage before you enter or leave a country	They check people's luggage carefully at the customs .
baggage claim (n) /'bæɡɪdʒ kleɪm/	the place at an airport where you get your bags, cases, etc. after your flight has landed	We should get our luggage back at the baggage claim .
