Faking it

A I first became interested in fake photography when I was a boy. My grandmother had a photo on her wall of a girl in a white dress. She was sitting on the grass – nothing amazing about that. ¹___ The fairy was slightly out of focus, but it looked very real. My grandmother insisted it was a real fairy, but as I grew older, I knew that the photos couldn't be real. The photo became very famous, and it wasn't until 1988 that the photo was revealed to be fake. My grandmother had already passed away by then. ²___

B I began making fake photos with an old second-hand camera that my uncle gave me. I created ghosts and monsters and took all kinds of strange and impossible shots.
