Use **some** and **any** to talk about the amount of something that there is. Use **some** in positive sentences and **any** in negatives and questions.

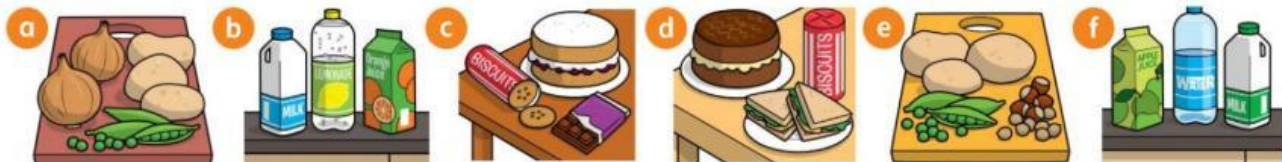
*There is **some** rice in the cupboard, but there aren't **any** noodles.*

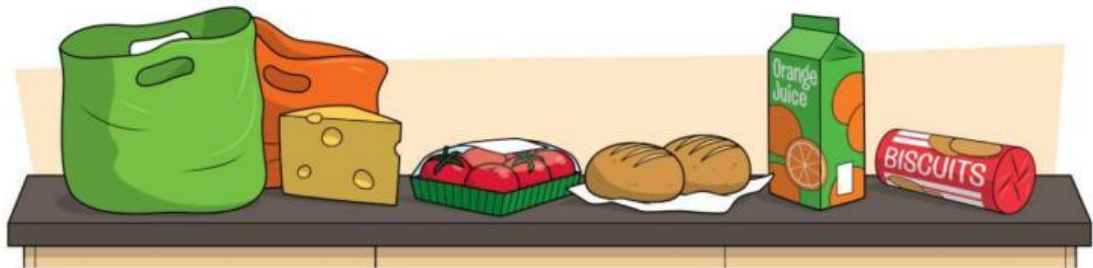
