

Superlatives



Language focus

Superlatives are used to describe a quality that a thing or person has the most or least of in a group.

*Laila is **the cleverest** student in the class.*

There are some rules to learn:

Put **the** before the adjective and add **est** to the end of adjectives with one syllable:
slow / the slowest

Put **the most** before adjectives of three or more syllables: **difficult / the most difficult**

Sometimes, when an adjective is written **consonant + vowel + consonant**, double the final consonant: **sad / the saddest**

When an adjective ends in **y**, change the **y** to an **i** and add **est**: **busy / the busiest**
