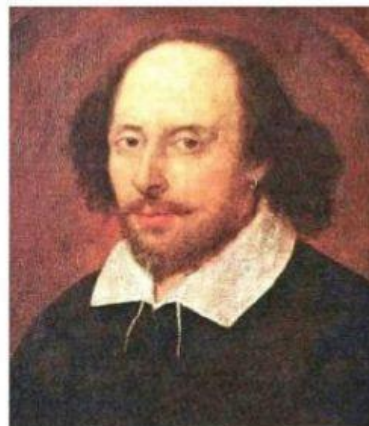
The Globe Theatre



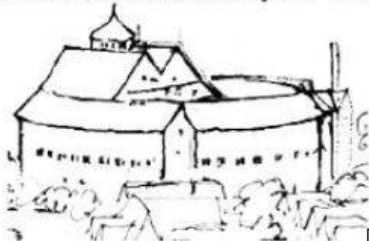
The first Globe theatre was built in 1599. It burned down in 1613. The one in London today is a new version that was built on the banks of the River Thames in 1997.
