

Too, enough and not enough - exercises



A SHORT NOTE

Too is an adverb which means *more than needed or wanted*.

for example: Isn't he too precise? I mean, we don't always have to do our work perfectly.

Enough is an adverb which means *as much as is necessary or needed*. for example: I don't like such weather, it isn't warm enough for me to go outside for a walk.
