- **Point out –** To attend a meeting or event as an observer.
- **Make up –** To discover or obtain information.
- **Go over –** To emit or project a certain impression or quality.
- **Break down –** To solve a problem or develop a plan.
- **Give off –** To simplify complex ideas or problems.
- **Work out –** To keep or retain something, often a value or principle.
- **Hold on to –** To review or examine something carefully.
- **Carry out –** To create or think of an idea or plan.
- **Come up with –** To accept or assume responsibility for something.
- **Set up –** To communicate an idea clearly.
- **Take on –** To establish or arrange something.
- **Get across –** To execute or perform a task or duty.
- **Bring in –** To improve or rescue a situation, often in business.
- **Move up –** To attract or generate revenue, clients, or business opportunities.
- **Turn around –** To be responsible for something or someone.
- **Look after –** To advance or get promoted in a job or career.
