

- **bicycle rack** – a place where you park your bike.
- **bench** – a piece of furniture where multiple people can sit.
- **pavement** – the area at the side of the road where pedestrians walk.
- **lamp post** – a tall post with a strong light on top.
- **phone box** – a place where you can make a phone call.
- **sculpture** – a model of a person or object, usually made of stone or metal.
- **parking meter** – a machine where you pay for parking your car.
- **bus stop** – a place where you wait for a bus.
- **stop sign** – a sign that tells drivers to stop.
- **fountain** – a stream of water, usually coming from a pool.
- **boxer** – a person who fights in a ring as a sport.
- **branch** – a part of a tree that grows out from the trunk.
- **bus** – a large vehicle that carries passengers.
- **cover** – something placed over another object.
- **message** – a written or spoken communication.
- **statue** – a three-dimensional representation of a person or thing, often in stone or metal.
- **street** – a public road in a city or town.
- **tree trunk** – the main wooden stem of a tree.
- **wool** – a material made from sheep's fleece.
- **writing** – text or characters inscribed on a surface.
- **attach** – to fasten or join one thing to another.
- **cover** – to place something over another object.
- **knit** – to make fabric by looping yarn with needles.
- **brightly coloured** – having vivid and strong colors.
- **patterned** – decorated with a repeated design.
- **striped** – having bands of different colors or shades.
- **art exhibition** – a display of artworks in a gallery or museum.
- **circus** – a show with acrobats, clowns, and trained animals.
- **classical concert** – a performance of orchestral or instrumental music.
- **comedy club** – a venue where comedians perform live.
- **magic show** – a performance featuring illusions and tricks.

- **musical** – a theatrical production with songs and music.
- **open-air theatre** – a stage performance conducted outdoors.
- **piano recital** – a solo performance by a pianist.
- **arena** – a large venue for sports or entertainment.
- **art gallery** – a place where artworks are exhibited.
- **comedy club** – a venue featuring stand-up comedy performances.
- **concert hall** – a building designed for music performances.
- **library** – a place where books and other media are stored for public use.
- **opera house** – a theatre designed for opera performances.
- **museum** – a building where historical or artistic objects are displayed.
