

Getting round London

Hire Bikes

Today, people in London have a new form of public transport, bikes! The bikes are blue and easy to see. People call them 'Boris Bikes' after London's Lord Mayor, Boris Johnson.

The first bikes appeared on the streets in 2010. At first there were around 5,000 bikes and over 300 bike stations. Today there are over 8,000 bikes and around 570 bike stations. All the stations are in central London. You can't start a journey in the suburbs.

They are quite cheap for short journeys. The first hour is only £1.00. It costs £6.00 for two hours, but then the price rises quickly, so you pay £15.00 for three hours. This is so people don't keep the bikes after they really need them.

The bikes are popular; one day during the London Olympics people used them for over 47,000 journeys in one day!

River Bus

Some people don't like going underground, don't want to ride a bike and don't like buses. How can they get round London? Well there are boats which travel along the River Thames. They are a good way to get round for people who live and work near the river. It's fun to see the city from the water. People on the River Bus always get a seat too, so it's very comfortable. They aren't cheap but you can buy weekly, monthly and annual tickets.

Cable Car

Going from North to South London and back can be difficult. The tubes and buses do go over the many bridges and in tunnels, but journeys can often take a long time. But now there is a new way of getting from Greenwich in the south to the Royal Docks in the north, it's a cable car. The cars go high in the air and you get great views of London and the River Thames.

The journey is quick: it takes less than 10 minutes.
