

1. Cat

Position of the target sound: Initial

Phonetic Transcription: /kæt/

Distinctive Features for /k/ : Plosive, Velar, Voiceless.

Sentence Example: The **cat** is sleeping on the couch.



2. Baking

Position of the target sound: Medial

Phonetic Transcription: /ˈbeɪkɪŋ/

Distinctive Features for /k/ : Plosive, Velar, Voiceless.

Sentence Example: She loves **baking** cakes for her friends.



3. Duck

Position of the target sound: Final

Phonetic Transcription: /dʌk/

Distinctive Features for /k/ : Plosive, Velar, Voiceless.

Sentence Example: The **duck** swam across the lake.



4. Goat

Position of the target sound: Initial

Phonetic Transcription: /goʊt/

Distinctive Features for /g/ : Plosive, Velar, Voiced.



Sentence Example: The **goat** climbed up the hill.

5. Bigger

Position of the target sound: Medial

Phonetic Transcription: /^hbɪ.gə/

Distinctive Features for /g/ : Plosive, Velar, Voiced.

Sentence Example: His new house is much **bigger** than the old one.



6. Dog

Position of the target sound: Final

Phonetic Transcription: /dɒg/



Distinctive Features for /g/ : Plosive, Velar, Voiced.
Sentence Example: My **dog** loves to play in the park.

7. Fish

Position of the target sound: Initial

Phonetic Transcription: /fɪʃ/

Distinctive Features for /f/ : Fricative, Labiodental, Voiceless.

Sentence Example: She caught a big **fish** in the river.



8. Coffee

Position of the target sound: Medial



Phonetic Transcription: /kɔː fi/

Distinctive Features for /f/ : Fricative, Labiodental, Voiceless.

Sentence Example: I need a cup of **coffee** to wake up.

9. Leaf

Position of the target sound: Final

Phonetic Transcription: /li:f/

Distinctive Features for /f/ : Fricative, Labiodental, Voiceless.

Sentence Example: A yellow **leaf** fell from the tree.



10. Van

Position of the target sound: Initial

Phonetic Transcription: /væn/

Distinctive Features for /v/ : Fricative, Labiodental, Voiced.

Sentence Example: The delivery **van** arrived early.



11. Even

Position of the target sound: Medial

Phonetic Transcription: /'i:.væn/

Distinctive Features for /v/ : Fricative, Labiodental, Voiced.

Sentence Example: She didn' t **even** notice the mistake.



12. Love

Position of the target sound: Final

Phonetic Transcription: /lʌv/

Distinctive Features for /v/ : Fricative, Labiodental, Voiced.

Sentence Example: He wrote a poem about **love**.



13. Think

Position of the target sound: Initial

Phonetic Transcription: /θɪŋk/

Distinctive Features for /θ/ : Fricative, Dental, Voiceless.



Sentence Example: I **think** we should leave now.

14. Author

position of the target sound: Medial

Phonetic Transcription: /bɪ.θə/

Distinctive Features for /θ/ : Fricative, Dental, Voiceless.

Sentence Example: The **author** signed my book.



15. Math

position of the target sound: Final

Phonetic Transcription: /mæθ/



Distinctive Features for / θ / : Fricative, Dental, Voiceless.
Sentence Example: Is my favorite subject.



16. This

position of the target sound: Initial

Phonetic Transcription: / ð Æ /

Distinctive Features for / ð / : Fricative, Dental, Voiced.

Sentence Example: **This** is my favorite song.



17. Mother

position of the target sound: Medial

Phonetic Transcription: /**mʌð.ə**/

Distinctive Features for /ð/ : Fricative, Dental, Voiced.

Sentence Example: My **mother** makes the best cookies.

18. Breathe

position of the target sound: Final

Phonetic Transcription: /**briːð**/

Distinctive Features for /ð/ : Fricative, Dental, Voiced.

Sentence Example: Take a deep **breathe** and relax.



19. Sun

position of the target sound: Initial

Phonetic Transcription: /sʌn/

Distinctive Features for /s/ : Fricative, Alveolar, Voiceless.

Sentence Example: The **sun** is shining brightly today.



20. Listen

position of the target sound: Medial

Phonetic Transcription: /ˈlɪs.ən/

Distinctive Features for /s/ : Fricative, Alveolar, Voiceless.

Sentence Example: Please **listen** carefully to the instructions.



21. Bus

position of the target sound: Final

Phonetic Transcription: /bʌs/

Distinctive Features for /s/ : Fricative, Alveolar, Voiceless.

Sentence Example: I took the **bus** to school.



22. Zebra

position of the target sound: Initial

Phonetic Transcription: /ˈziː.brə/

Distinctive Features for /z/ : Fricative, Alveolar, Voiced.



Sentence Example: The **zebra** has black and white stripes.

23. Music

position of the target sound: Medial

Phonetic Transcription: /^hmju:.z^k/

Distinctive Features for /z/ : Fricative, Alveolar, Voiced.

Sentence Example: I love listening to **music** while I work.



24. Buzz

position of the target sound: Final

Phonetic Transcription: /bʌz/



Distinctive Features for /z/ : Fricative, Alveolar, Voiced.

Sentence Example: I can hear the **buzz** of the bees in the garden.
