Today, I'd like to give you some tips on getting the best flight deals. It all depends on what you're looking for, but let's start with a typical scenario of a fixed destination and more or less fixed dates. Typically, you'll find all the airlines have similar prices, making comfort the deciding factor. Browse websites such as seatmaestro or skytrax for the latest passenger reviews of the meals, the in-flight entertainment, and the size and comfort of the seats of particular airlines.

If comfort is your priority and money is no object, you might consider flying business class. Then you can let your hair down and start your vacation as soon as you board the plane. If such a ticket is too expensive for you, there are still ways to make your trip in economy more enjoyable.

Did you know that certain rows have more legroom than others? These so-called exit-gate rows might cost a bit more, but in some airlines they don't and you can ask to be moved there at the boarding gate. Check out websites such as seatguru to find layouts of the actual planes and see where these rows are located. Another reason why these planes are useful is that sitting before rather than behind the engines can make all the difference between a relatively quiet and a noisy flight. Additionally, you might consider aisle seats to be able to occasionally stretch your legs or window seats to give you a wall to lean. That's why online check-in should be done as early as possible, allowing for a wider choice of seats.

On the other hand, if you're more flexible about your dates and destinations and enjoy taking city breaks over the weekends then consider budget airlines. Tickets for European flights bought in advance can cost next to nothing. Those on longer distances, however, can require lengthy stopovers. Just be aware that neither your suitcase nor the refreshments are free of charge. Also, budget airlines often make use of airports that are an hour or so outside the city so getting to and from your destination might cost you many hours which can be a problem if it's just a weekend trip.
