

1. CAR

Phonetic transcription:

/kɑːr/

Distinctive features for /k/:

Velar, voiceless, and stop consonant.

Sentence example:

My car is red.

She doesn't like that car.

Do you have a car?



2. BECOME

Phonetic transcription:

/bɪ'kʌm/

Distinctive features for /k/:

Velar, voiceless, and stop consonant.

Sentence example:

She wants to become a doctor in the future.

He did not become a doctor.

How did he become a doctor?



3. CAT

Phonetic transcription:

/kæt/

Distinctive features for /k/:

Velar, voiceless, and stop consonant.

Sentence example:

The cat is sleeping on the table.

I don't have a cat.

Do you like cats?



4.DOG

Phonetic transcription:

/dɑ:g/

Distinctive features for /g/:

Consonantal, voiced, not nasal, not anterior, constricted glottis.

Sentence example:

My dog is brown.

I don't have a dog.

Does your dog like to run?



5.GAME

Phonetic transcription:

/geɪm/

Distinctive features for /g/:

Consonantal, voiced, not nasal, not anterior, constricted glottis.

Sentence example:

The team won the game.

This game is not fun.

Do you want to play a game?



6. GARDEN

Phonetic transcription:

/ˈgɑːr.dən/

Distinctive features for /g/:

Consonantal, voiced, not nasal, not anterior, constricted glottis.



Sentence example:

The garden is beautiful with flowers.

The garden is not ready for planting.

Do you like working in the garden?

7.FISH

Phonetic transcription:

/fɪʃ/

Distinctive features for /f/:

Labial, voiceless, continuant

Sentence example:

The fish is swimming in the lake.

She doesn't eat fish.

Can fish live in fresh water?



8. FINGER

Phonetic transcription:

/ˈfɪŋ.gə/

Distinctive features for /f/:

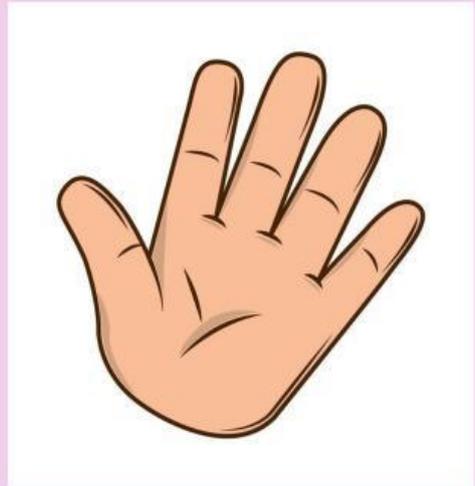
Labial, voiceless, continuant.

Sentence example:

I have five fingers.

My finger is not hurting anymore.

How many fingers do you have?



9. COFFEE

Phonetic transcription:

/ˈkɑːfi/

Distinctive features for /f/:

Labial, voiceless, continuant.

Sentence example:

Aleyda wants coffee with milk.

My friend doesn't drink coffee at all.

Do you want some coffee?



10. GLOVE

Phonetic transcription:

/glʌv/

Distinctive features for /v/:

Voiced, continuant, and anterior consonant.

Sentence example:

She wore a blue glove on her left hand.

He didn't find his glove in the bag.

Where is your glove?



11.LOVE

Phonetic transcription:

/lʌv/

Distinctive features for /v/:

Voiced, continuant, and anterior consonant.

Sentence example:

My eternal love is my grandmother.

We don't love this new restaurant.

Do you love your job?



12. SEVEN

Phonetic transcription:

/ˈsev.ən/

Distinctive features for /v/:

Voiced, continuant, and anterior consonant.

Sentence example:

I wake up at seven every morning.

They didn't arrive at seven o'clock.

Do you have seven pets?
