

13. TEETH

Phonetic transcription:

/ti:θ/

Distinctive features for /θ/:

Voiceless, dental, and fricative.

Sentence example:

He has very healthy teeth.

She doesn't brush her teeth before bed.

How many teeth do you have?



14.THINK

Phonetic transcription:

/θɪŋk/

Distinctive features for /θ/:

Voiceless, dental, and fricative.

Sentence example:

She thinks about her future a lot.

I don't think this is a good idea.

What do you think about the new restaurant?



15.BATHROOM

Phonetic transcription:

/ˈbæθ.rʊm/

Distinctive features for /θ/:

Voiceless, dental, and fricative.

Sentence example:

The bathroom is next to the kitchen.

We don't have a bathroom on the first floor.

Is the bathroom clean?



16. MOTHER

Phonetic transcription:

/ˈmʌð.ə/

Distinctive features for /ð/:

voiced, non-strident, and continuant.

Sentence example:

My mother cooks delicious food.

She doesn't live with her mother anymore.

Is your mother at home today?



17. SMOOTH

Phonetic transcription:

/smu:ð/

Distinctive features for /ð/:

voiced, non-strident, and continuant.

Sentence example:

He has smooth, shiny hair.

This cream doesn't feel smooth on my skin.

Does this lotion make your skin feel smooth?



18. BROTHER

Phonetic transcription:

/ˈbrʌð.ə/

Distinctive features for /ð/:

voiced, non-strident, and continuant.

Sentence example:

My brother plays soccer every Saturday.

My brother isn't at home right now.

How old is your brother?



19. SCHOOL

Phonetic transcription:

/sku:l/

Distinctive features for /s/:

Voiceless, alveolar, fricative

Sentence example:

She loves her school because it has a big library.

I don't like going to school on Mondays.

Do you like school?



20. SUN

Phonetic transcription:

/sʌn/

Distinctive features for /s/:

Voiceless, alveolar, fricative

Sentence example:

The sun is shining brightly today.

The sun isn't shining today.

Can you feel the sun on your skin?



21. GLASS

Phonetic transcription:

/glæs/

Distinctive features for /s/:

Voiceless, alveolar, fricative.

Sentence example:

The glass of water was on the table.

The glass is not clean

How many glasses of water do you drink a day?



22. ZEBRA

Phonetic transcription:

/ˈziː.brə/

Distinctive features for /z/:

Voiced, coronal, and strident.

Sentence example:

We saw a zebra at the zoo yesterday.

My brother doesn't like zebras.

Have you ever seen a zebra in person?



23.BUSY

Phonetic transcription:

/ˈbɪz.i/

Distinctive features for /z/:

Voiced, coronal, and strident.

Sentence example:

I am too busy to go out today.

He restaurant isn't busy in the mornings.

Are you busy right now?



24. FROZEN

Phonetic transcription:

/ˈfroʊ.zən/

Distinctive features for /z/:

Voiced, coronal, and strident.

Sentence example:

The water is frozen.

The lake is not frozen yet.

Is the river frozen in winter?
