

PRODUCING /k/:

1.CAT

Phonetic Transcription:

/kæt/

Distinctive features for /k/:

Tongue, occlusive, voiceless



Sentence example:

The grey cat is beautiful.

2.KISS

Phonetic Transcription: /kɪs/

Distinctive features for /k/:

Tongue, occlusive, voiceless

Sentence example:

I like to give you a kiss.



3. Sick

Phonetic Transcription: /sɪk/

Distinctive features for /k/:

Tongue, occlusive, voiceless

Sentence Example: She feels very sick today.



Producing /g/:

1. EGG

Phonetic Transcription: /ɛg/

Distinctive features for /g/:

Tongue, occlusive, voiced

Sentence Example:

The farm eggs are very fresh.



2. BAG

Phonetic Transcription: /bæg/

Distinctive features for /g/:

Tongue, occlusive, voiced

Sentence Example: I love to use a bag every day.



3. GHOST

Phonetic Transcription: /gəʊst/

Distinctive features for /g/:

Tongue, occlusive, voiced

Sentence Example: I don't like ghosts, because they scare me too much.



Producing /f/:

1. Phone

Phonetic Transcription: /fəʊn/

Distinctive features for /f/:

Labiodental, fricative, voiceless

Sentence Example:

I don't like to use my phone during the day.



2. COFFEE

Phonetic Transcription: /'kɒfi/

Distinctive features for /f/:

Labiodental, fricative, voiceless

Sentence Example:

I love to drink coffee in the mornings.



3.FOOD

Phonetic Transcription: /fu:d/

Distinctive features for /f/:

Labiodental, fricative, voiceless

Sentence Example:

My favorite food is seafood and hamburgers.



PRODUCING /V/

1. VOICE

Phonetic Transcription: /vɔɪs/

Distinctive features for /v/:

Labiodental, fricative, voiced



Sentence Example: My voice sounds very good when I sing.

2. Village

Phonetic Transcription: /'vɪlɪdʒ/

Distinctive features for /v/:

Labiodental fricative, voiced



Sentence Example: I don't like to go to the village because it is too far away.

3. Clever

Phonetic Transcription: /'kleɪvə/

Distinctive features for /v/:

Labiodental, fricative, voiced



Sentence Example: Andres is very clever in mathematics.

PRODUCING /θ/

1. HEALTHY

Phonetic Transcription: /'hɛlθi/

Distinctive features for /θ/:

Dental,fricative,voiceless



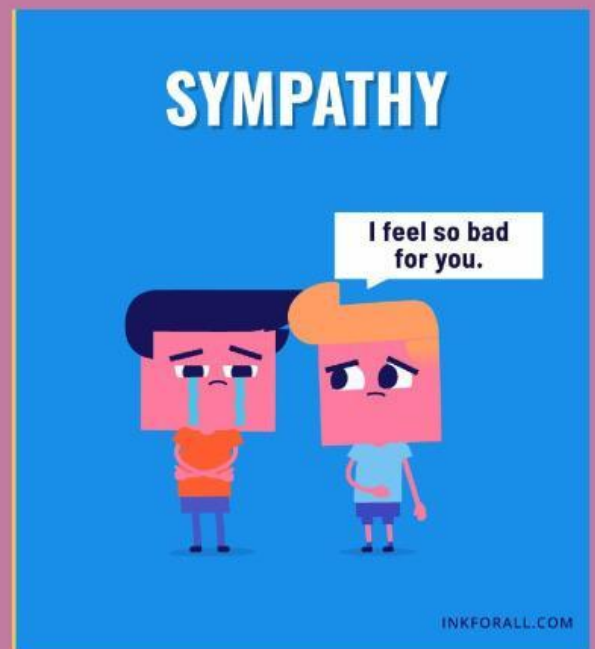
Sentence Example: I don't like to eat healthy every day.

2. SYMPATHY

Phonetic Transcription: /'sɪmpəθi/

Distinctive features for /θ/:

Dental,fricative,voiceless



Sentence Example: My friend Pedro has a lot of sympathy.

3. Thirty

Phonetic Transcription: /'θɜːti/

Distinctive features for /θ/:

Dental, fricative, voiceless



Sentence Example: I want to get thirty apples.

Producing /ð/

1. FATHER

Phonetic Transcription: /'fɑːðə/

Distinctive features for /ð/:

Dental, fricative, voiced



Sentence Example: My father is a hero.

2. THEY

Phonetic Transcription: /ðeɪ/

Distinctive features for /ð/:

Dental, fricative, voiced



Sentence Example: They do not like to attend classes.

3. CLOTHE

Phonetic Transcription: /kləʊð/

Distinctive features for /ð/:

Dental, fricative, voiced



Sentence Example: I like to keep my clothes tidy.

PRODUCING /s/:

1. RACE

Phonetic Transcription: /reɪs/

Distinctive features for /s/:

Alveolar, fricative, voiceless



Sentence Example: The race was spectacular .

2. SCENE

Phonetic Transcription: /si:n/

Distinctive features for /s/:

Alveolar, fricative, voiceless



Sentence Example: The scene of the movie is very interesting.

3. SAD

Phonetic Transcription: /sæd/

Distinctive features for /s/:

Alveolar, fricative, voiceless



Sentence Example: Sometimes I don't like to feel sad .

Producing /z/:

1. CRAZY

Phonetic Transcription: /'kreɪzi/

Distinctive features for /z/:

Interdental, fricative, voiceless



Sentence Example: People are crazy.

2. ZERO

Phonetic Transcription: /'zɪərəʊ/

Distinctive features for /z/:

Interdental, fricative, voiceless



Sentence Example: I like to drink coke zero.

3. Noisy

Phonetic Transcription: /'nɔɪzi/

Distinctive features for /z/:

Interdental, fricative, voiceless



Sentence Example: I don't like noisy places .
