

1. KISS

phonetic transcription: /kɪs/

Distinctive features for /k/: stop, velar, voiceless.

sentence sample: She wants to kiss her boyfriend.



2. CHICKEN

phonetic transcription: /ˈtʃɪk.ɪn/

Distinctive features for /k/: stop, velar, voiceless.

sentence sample: My favorite food is chicken.




3. KEY

phonetic transcription: /ki:/

Distinctive features for /k/: stop, velar, voiceless.

sentence sample: I lost my key yesterday.



1. GHOST

phonetic transcription: /gʊʊst/

Distinctive features for /g/: stop, velar, voiced.

sentence sample: I hate ghosts.



2. FORGET

phonetic transcription: /fə'get/

Distinctive features for /g/: stop, velar, voiced.

sentence sample: I sometimes forget important dates.



3. BAG

phonetic transcription: /bæg/

Distinctive features for /g/: stop, velar, voiced.

sentence sample: She loves purple bags.



1. FUN

phonetic transcription: /fʌŋ/

Distinctive features for /f/: fricative, labiodental, voiceless.

sentence sample: I like to have fun with friends and family.



2. COFFEE

phonetic transcription: /'kɑː.fi/

Distinctive features for /f/: fricative, labiodental, voiceless.

sentence sample: I drink a cup of coffee every morning.



3. ROUGH

phonetic transcription: /rʌf/

Distinctive features for /f/: fricative, labiodental, voiceless.

sentence sample: Her hands get rough when it is too cold.



1. VILLAGE

phonetic transcription: /ˈvɪl.ɪdʒ/

Distinctive features for /v/: fricative, labiodental, voiced.

sentence sample: I live in a small village.



2. OVER

phonetic transcription: /ˈoʊ.vər/

Distinctive features for /v/: fricative, labiodental, voiced.

sentence sample: Time is over.



3. GIVE

phonetic transcription: /ɡɪv/

Distinctive features for /v/: fricative, labiodental, voiced.

sentence sample: Give me my cellphone, please.



1. THIRTY

phonetic transcription: /'θɜːtɪ/

Distinctive features for /θ/: voiceless, dental, and fricative.

sentence sample: I am thirty years old.



2. NOTHING

phonetic transcription: /'nʌθ.ɪŋ/

Distinctive features for /θ/: voiceless, dental, and fricative.

sentence sample: I do nothing on weekends.




3. HEALTHY

phonetic transcription: /'hel.θi/

Distinctive features for /θ/: voiceless, dental, and fricative.

sentence sample: They love healthy food.



1. THEY

phonetic transcription: /ðeɪ/

Distinctive features for /ð/: a voiced, non-strident, continuant sound.

sentence sample: They are my friends.



2. FATHER

phonetic transcription: /'fɑ:.ðə/

Distinctive features for /ð/: a voiced, non-strident, continuant sound.

sentence sample: I love my father



3. CLOTHE

phonetic transcription: /kloʊð/

Distinctive features for /ð/: a voiced, non-strident, continuant sound.

sentence sample: It costs a lot to clothe and feed 5 kids.



1. SEE

phonetic transcription: /si:/

Distinctive features for /s/: voiceless, alveolar, and fricative.

sentence sample: I will see you tomorrow.



2. RACE

phonetic transcription: /reɪs/

Distinctive features for /s/: voiceless, alveolar, and fricative.

sentence sample: She will win the race.



3. CEASE

phonetic transcription: /si:s/

Distinctive features for /s/: voiceless, alveolar, and fricative.

sentence sample: Your company will cease operations tomorrow.



1. ZERO

phonetic transcription: /'zɪr.oʊ/

Distinctive features for /z/: voiced, labio-palatal, and strident.

sentence sample: He got zero in his exam.



2. THESE

phonetic transcription: /ði:z/

Distinctive features for /z/: voiced, labio-palatal, and strident.

sentence sample: These are your photos.



3. NOISY

phonetic transcription: /'nɔɪ.zi/

Distinctive features for /z/: voiced, labio-palatal, and strident.

sentence sample: I do not like noisy neighbors.
