Phonetic Transcription

Distinctive Feature for /k/

Voiceless stops, velar and plosive.

Sentence sample:

Please, be quiet.



## 2. BOOK

Phonetic Transcription

/bʊk/

Distinctive Feature for /k/

Voiceless stops, velar and plosiv

Sentence sample:

I really loved reading that book.



### 3. CAME

**Phonetic Transcription**

/keɪm/

**Distinctive Feature for /k/**

Voiceless, velar and plosive.

**Sentence sample:**

I just came back from work.



### 4. FORGET

**Phonetic Transcription**

/fə'get/

**Distinctive Feature for /g/**

Voiced, velar and plosive.

**Sentence sample:**

He forgot his homework at home.



## 5. GHOST

**Phonetic Transcription**

/goost/

**Distinctive Feature for /g/**

Voiced, velar and plosive.

**Sentence sample:**

The ghost really scared me.



## 6. BAG

**Phonetic Transcription**

bæg/

**Distinctive Feature for /g/**

Voiced, velar and plosive.

**Sentence sample:**

My bag is lost.



## 7. PHONE

Phonetic Transcription

/fəʊn/

Distinctive Feature for /g/

Fricative and voiceless.

Sentence sample:

The phone is not working yet.



## 8. FREE

Phonetic Transcription

/fri:/

Distinctive Feature for /g/

Fricative and voiceless.

Sentence sample:

You are free to choose.



## 9. FUN

Phonetic Transcription

/fʌn/

Distinctive Feature for /g/

Fricative and voiceless.

Sentence sample:

The kids are having a lot of fun right now.



## 10. VILLAGE

Phonetic Transcription

/'vɪ.lɪdʒ/

Distinctive Feature for /v/

Fricative, voiced and labiodental.

Sentence sample:

This village is beautiful.



## 11. BRAVE

Phonetic Transcription

/breɪv/

Distinctive Feature for /v/

Fricative, voiced and labiodental.

Sentence sample:

They are brave enough to climb that volcano.



## 12. DRIVER

Phonetic Transcription

/'draɪ.və/

Distinctive Feature for /v/

Fricative, voiced and labiodental.

Sentence sample:

This driver is going too fast.

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## 13. THIRTY

Phonetic Transcription

/θɜː.ti/

Distinctive Feature for /θ/

Fricative, voiceless and dental.

Sentence sample:

I'm turning thirty this year.



## 14. HEALTHY

Phonetic Transcription

/hel.θi/

Distinctive Feature for /θ/

Fricative, voiceless and dental.

Sentence sample:

Eating well makes feel healthy.



## 15. THANK

**Phonetic Transcription**

/θæŋk/

**Distinctive Feature for /θ/**

Fricative, voiceless and dental.

**Sentence sample:**

Thank God is Friday.



## 16. FATHER

**Phonetic Transcription**

/'fɑ:.ðə/

**Distinctive Feature for /θ/**

Fricative, voiced and dental.

**Sentence sample:**

My father goes to work from Monday to Friday.



## 17. BOTHER

### Phonetic Transcription

/ˈbɔː.ðə/

### Distinctive Feature for /θ/

Fricative, voiced and dental.

### Sentence sample:

That noise really bothers me.



## 18. THIS

### Phonetic Transcription

/ðɪs/

### Distinctive Feature for /θ/

Fricative, voiced and dental.

### Sentence sample:

This is an apple.



## 19. CENT

**Phonetic Transcription**

/sɛnt/

**Distinctive Feature for /s/**

Fricative, voiceless and alveolar.

**Sentence sample:**

We do nothing with a cent.



## 20. SCENE

**Phonetic Transcription**

/si:n/

**Distinctive Feature for /s/**

Fricative, voiceless and alveolar.

**Sentence sample:**

We love this natural scene.



## 21. MISSING

Phonetic Transcription

/ˈmɪs.ɪŋ/

Distinctive Feature for /s/

Fricative, voiceless and alveolar.

Sentence sample:

My dog has been missing since yesterday.



## 22. DIZZY

Phonetic Transcription

/ˈdɪz.i/

Distinctive Feature for /z/

Fricative, voiced and alveolar.

Sentence sample:

Peter felt dizzy during the road trip.



## 23. NOISY

**Phonetic Transcription**

*/ˈnɔɪ.zi/*

**Distinctive Feature for /z/**

Fricative, voiced and alveolar.

**Sentence sample:**

The music is very noisy.



## 24. CRIES

**Phonetic Transcription**

*/kraɪz/*

**Distinctive Feature for /z/**

Fricative, voiced and alveolar.

**Sentence sample:**

I don't like it when she cries.
