1. Can

Phonetic Transcription

/kæn/

Distinctive features for /k/

Your vocal cords do not vibrate

Sentence Sample:

I can cook Lasagna.



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2. take

Phonetic Transcription

/teɪk /

Distinctive features for /k/

Hold a piece of paper in front of your lips

Sentence Sample

Alvaro take me to the movie.



3. Glass

Phonetic Transcription

/ [glæs

Distinctive Features for /g/

Then, quickly lower the back of your tongue.

Sentence Sample

A glass of water



4. Flag

Phonetic Transcription

/flæg/

Distinctive Features for /g/

It should move when you produce the sound

Sentence Sample

The flag of El Salvador is blue and white.



5. Inflation

Phonetic Transcription

/ɪnˈfleɪʃən/

Distinctive Features for /f/

Produce the sound by forcing air out through the opening.

Sentences Sample

The economy is at risk due to inflation.



6. Sniffle

Phonetic Transcription

/ˈsnɪfəl/

Distinctive Features for /f/

Your vocal cords do not vibrate.

Sentence Sample

You're sniffing a lot today, have you got a cold?



7. Have

Phonetic Transcription
/hæv/

Distinctive Features for /v/

This sound is produced the same way as [f],
except that {v} is voiced

Sentences Sample

Do you have a pet?

8. Very

VERY

Phonetic Transcription

/ˈver.i/

Distinctive Features for /v/

Your vocal cords should vibrate

Sentences Sample

It is very hot today



9. Rival

Phonetic Transcription

/ˈraɪ.vəl/

Distinctive Features for /v/

Hold your hand in front of your lips to feel the flow of air as you hear it.

Sentences Sample

The teams have been longtime rivals



10. Thin

Phonetic Transcription

/θɪn/

Distinctive Features for /θ/

Your upper teeth rest on your tongue lightly.

Sentence Sample

He is small and very thin



11. Math

Phonetic Transcription
/mæθ/

Distinctive Features for /θ/
Your vocal cords do not vibrate.
Sentence Sample
Alize loves math



12. Think

Phonetic Transcription
/θɪŋk/

Distinctive Features for /θ/
Hold your hand in front of your lips to feel
the flow of air as you hear it.
Sentence Sample
I am thinking about our relationship.

Another

Phonetic Transcription
/ə'nʌð.ə/

Distinctive Features for /ð/
This sound is produced the same way /θ/, except that /ð/ is
voiced.
Sentences Sample

Would you like another cup of tea?



14. Bathe

Phonetic Transcription

/beɪð/

Distinctive Features for /ð/

Your upper teeth rest on your tongue lightly.

Sentence Sample

Bathe your eye with cool salty water



15. Those

Phonetic Transcription

/ðəʊz/

Distinctive Features for /ð/

Your vocal cords should vibrate.

Sentence Sample

I really like those cats.



16. Cent

Phonetic Transcription

/sent/

Distinctive Features for /s/

Point the tongue tip toward the upper gum ridge, but do not touch it.

Sentence Sample

You need eighty cents more



17. Decide

Phonetic Transcription

/dɪ'saɪd/

Distinctive Features for /s/

Your vocal cords do not vibrate.

Sentences Sample

I decide to study English



18. Sad

Phonetic Transcription

/sæd/

Distinctive Features for /s/

Press the sides of your tongue against the upper teeth.

Sentence Sample

I feel sad when I lost my keys



19. Crazy

Phonetic Transcription

/'kreɪ.zi/

Distinctive Features for /z/

Point the tongue tip toward the upper gum ridge, but do not touch it.

Sentence Sample

You are crazy to have paid so much for this car.



20. Noisy

Phonetic Transcription

/ˈnɔɪ.zi/

Distinctive Features for /z/

This sound is produced the same way as /s/ except that /z/ is voiced.

Sentence Sample

The playground was filled with noisy children



21. Zoo

Phonetic Transcription

/zu:/

Distinctive Features for /z/

Your vocal cords should vibrate.

Sentence Sample

Jeremy loves to go to the zoo

Phonetic Transcription

/ə'gen/

Distinctive Features for /g/

This sound has an aspirate quality [you can hear the puff of air as a whisper]

Sentence Sample

Please, come see us again



23. England

Phonetic transcription

/ˈɪŋ.glənd/ /g/

Distinctive Features for

This sound does not have an aspirate quality.

Sentence Sample

A judge told her father to come to England to take her home

/bɪˈkʌm/

Distinctive Features for /k/

Then, quickly lower the back of your

We became interested in the property last year.
