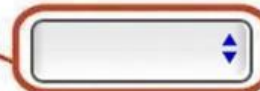
This is the screen that lets you see what you're doing on the computer.



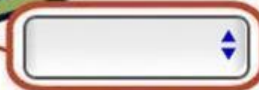
This is inside your computer and stores all your files.

In 1999, a student named Shawn Fanning created **Napster**, a program that changed the way people listened to music. Napster allowed users to share music files with each other for free. It became very popular, especially among young people, because they could download songs quickly without paying.

However, Napster soon faced many problems. Music companies and artists said it was **illegal** because people were sharing songs without buying them. In 2001, Napster was forced to shut down after several lawsuits.

Although Napster ended, it had a big impact. It showed the power of the internet in music sharing and started a new era of digital music. Later, legal services like iTunes, Spotify, and Apple Music appeared, offering safe and paid ways to enjoy music online.
