


The maps below show a plan of a city in 1950 and at the present.

 - to undergo expansion: mở rộng, bành trướng
- **infrastructure** /'ɪn.fra.strʌk.tʃər/ [C1] = the basic systems and services, such as transport and power supplies, that a country or organization uses in order to work effectively - **Hệ tầng cơ sở**
 - *Improvements are being made to the region's decrepit infrastructure.*
- **To reshape** /,ri:ʃeɪp/ = shape something again or differently: **TÁI TẠO, TÁI ĐỊNH HÌNH**
- **Governments have sought to reduce or reshape health programs.**

- **To dominate** /'dəʊ.mɪ.næt/ [C1] = to be the largest, most important, or most noticeable part of something
The cathedral dominates the landscape for miles around.
- **To ensure** /ɪn'ʃɔ:r/ [B2] = make something certain to happen
The airline is taking steps to ensure safety on its aircraft.
