

# First Conditional

The first conditional is used when there is a real possibility that a condition will happen in the future.

<b>IF CLAUSE OR CONDITION = PRESENT SIMPLE</b> <i>If it rains,</i>	<b>MAIN CLAUSE OR RESULT = WILL</b> <i>he will bring his umbrella</i>
<b>MAIN CLAUSE OR RESULT = WILL</b> <i>He will bring his umbrella</i>	<b>IF CLAUSE OR CONDITION = PRESENT SIMPLE</b> <i>if it rains.</i>
