When I was at school in the UK, we had a choice of two languages - Latin or ancient Greek. We had to study one - there was no avoiding them. The teachers at the time told us that we would benefit greatly from learning these languages as they can help with scientific and technological vocabulary. So, we all studied hard to learn our verb tables and grammar. With the aim of using it correctly in tests. We never actually communicated in these languages - there was no speaking involved. Later, in the sixth form, I was offered the chance to learn a modern foreign language, but I wasn't so

interested by then. I preferred more 'academic' subjects like literature and history. I kept away from those classrooms, despite seeing lively cheerful, conversations going on whenever I passed them. What a mistake that was, I now realize, as every summer I try to make myself understood on holiday in France and Spain. Ordering a drink or hiring a beach umbrella would be much easier if I had taken the opportunity that was offered to me when I was 16.

In my children's school, the curriculum offers several languages, but they are all optional, and are, as in all schools, not as popular as in the past. Maths, science and technology seem to getting more popular, and many young people nowadays see studying a language as a waste of time when they can access immediate translations using apps and websites. Even if they are not always accurate. As far as they are concerned, face-to-face communication is less common now, and people chat to friends on social media anyway. This means that learning

another language when you don't even use your own very often, must seem pointless to some people. However, the benefits of learning a language are far greater than just the ability to get things done or make small talk. Languages reflect the cultures in which they are used and help us to understand and enjoy different ways of seeing and describing the world. In addition, studies I have seen state that a brain that has learned languages is better trained for other subjects involving patterns and systems, like maths and music.

I wish I could persuade my teenagers to look up from their phones when we are on our family trips abroad and open their ears and minds to the new and interesting things in the environment around them. I fear that a few adults of the future may even forget how to speak at all because they prefer using messages. I still think nice it is to learn and speak other languages, and I don't think I'm the only one.
