When Do We Use the Passive Voice?

- When the doer is unknown or unimportant

Sometimes, we don't know or don't care who performed the action.

"The cake was eaten."

(We don't know or need to know who ate the cake.)

- When we want to emphasize the action or the object

In scientific, formal, or technical writing, the focus is often on the action rather than the person doing it.

"The report was submitted yesterday."

(Here, the focus is on the action of submission, not the person who submitted it.)

- When the doer is obvious or general

Sometimes the doer is obvious from the context, and we don't need to mention it.

"The documents were delivered."

(It's obvious that someone, such as a delivery person, did it.)



Notes

- By + Doer

If you want to mention who performed the action, you can add "by" + the doer at the end of the sentence.

Example:

"The book was written by J.K. Rowling."

(Here, "by J.K. Rowling" tells us who wrote the book.)

- Omitting the doer: Often, in the passive voice, the doer is not mentioned because it's either unknown or irrelevant.

Example:

"The report was finished."

(We don't mention who finished it because it's not important.)



Passive vs. Active Sentences



Active Voice:

"The teacher explains the lesson."

(Focus is on the teacher performing the action.)

Passive Voice:

"The lesson is explained by the teacher."

(Focus is on the lesson being explained.)



Structure

[Subject] + [form of "to be"] + [past participle of the main verb]

- Present Simple Passive

Structure: Subject + am/is/are + past participle

"The house is cleaned every day."

(The house is the subject, "is" is the correct form of "to be", and "cleaned" is the past participle of "clean".)

- Past Simple Passive

Structure: Subject + was/were + past participle

"The letter was sent last week."

("The letter" is the subject, "was" is the correct form of "to be", and "sent" is the past participle of "send".)

- Present Continuous Passive

Structure: Subject + am/is/are + being + past participle

"The car is being repaired."

("The car" is the subject, "is" is the correct form of "to be", "being" is used to indicate the continuous action, and "repaired" is the past participle of "repair".)

- Past Continuous Passive

Structure: Subject + was/were + being + past participle

"The cake was being decorated when I arrived."

("The cake" is the subject, "was" is the correct form of "to be", "being" indicates the continuous action, and "decorated" is the past participle of "decorate".)

- Present Perfect Passive

Structure: Subject + has/have + been + past participle

"The project has been completed."

("The project" is the subject, "has" is the correct form of "to be", "been" indicates the perfect aspect, and "completed" is the past participle of "complete".)

- Future Simple Passive

Structure: Subject + will be + past participle

"The documents will be signed tomorrow."

("The documents" is the subject, "will" is the future form of "to be", and "signed" is the past participle of "sign".)

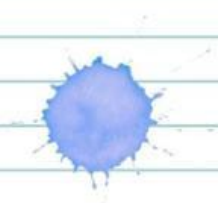
