The Great Wall of China

The Great Wall of China is one of the most famous and impressive structures in the world. It stretches over 13,000 miles across northern China, winding through mountains, deserts, and grasslands. The wall was originally built more than 2,000 years ago to protect China from invaders, mainly from the north. Over the centuries, different dynasties repaired and expanded the wall to make it stronger.
