



**Niagara Falls**

Niagara Falls is one of the most popular tourist attractions in the world. It attracts more than 30 million visitors every year.

You'll actually find three different falls here, two in the USA and one in Canada. The largest of the three is Horseshoe Falls in Canada, which is shaped like a horse's shoe. Bridal Veil Falls and the larger American Falls are in the USA.

It's easy to get a good view of the falls from the street but for those more adventurous people, there are three other exciting ways to see the falls.
