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Grammar Focus – Future Speculation

Explanation:

When we talk about the future, we use different structures depending on how certain or uncertain we are.

Structure	Example	Meaning
Will (+ base verb)	<i>Technology will keep evolving.</i>	High certainty
Might / Could (+ base verb)	<i>AI might replace some jobs.</i>	Possibility, 50/50 chance
Be likely to (+ base verb)	<i>Self-driving cars are likely to become common.</i>	Strong probability (70-90%)

💡 Note:

- *Might* and *could* are interchangeable for future possibilities.
- *Be likely to* is more formal than *might/could* and sounds slightly stronger.
