IF CLAUSE = PAST PERFECT

If I had won the lottery,

MAIN CLAUSE = WOULD + HAVE + PAST PARTICIPLE

I would have travelled the world.

RESULT = WOULD + HAVE + PAST PARTICIPLE

I would have travelled the world

IF CLAUSE = PAST PERFECT

if I had won the lottery.
